Wisdom empowers someone to work towards the good of one's neighbor, regardless of race, culture, creed, ideology, or gender.

As examples and role models for leaders of tomorrow, we have the great privilege of recognizing three remarkable individuals who, through their hard

work, persistence, passion and creativity, have risen to the top of their professions. The dedicated and far-reaching work of the 2022 award-winners, **Victoria Kaspi, Claudia Mitchell** and **Meejin Yoon** inspire all of us. My admiration goes out to them and to many others who have combined a great heart with a brilliant mind.
