Distinguished authorities of McGill University, respected laureates, dear guests, ladies and gentlemen,

The world is going through a deep crisis. The solution does not lie in increased intellectuality, but in a pursuit of goodness and desire to serve others. The answer must involve strengthening peoples' values, integrity, and virtues.

As an inspiration for future leaders, today we have the great privilege of recognizing remarkable individuals who through hard work, persistence and creativity have risen to the top of their professions. **Professor Eske Willerslev** is a great scientist and a leader amongst his peers. Yet, he is also an ambassador for science who takes time to communicate the richness of science to youth and lay people. **Mr Cónal Creedon**, though his writings and creative works brings color to our imaginations and helps us appreciate beauty in day-to-day interactions. Our previous winner, **Professor Omar Yaghi**, who is stepping in for the role of WCC President, is demonstrating how basic science can serve humanity by offering solutions for clean water, clean air, and clean energy which impact our health, happiness, and future.

These award winners represent visionaries who have been able to combine a great heart with a brilliant mind. They give hope that, despite the dark clouds looming over us, we can forge ahead with the optimism that this world and humankind will outlive its shortcomings.
